### New Voices: The Making of a PSA

The New Voices Lions are a diverse group selected for their dynamic and innovative contributions in the areas of: service (Lion Jenny White, Honolulu Chinatown), membership (Lion Paul Seto, Kahului), leadership (Lion Chris Chow, Waikiki 2000) and marketing (Lion Renee Ako, Koko Head).

n April 6th, the New Voices Lions captured enough footage to create 12 PSAs (public service announcements) focusing on Lions Clubs International's eight global causes, D50's disaster response efforts in Maui, and how D50 is making a difference in our communities. These PSAs will be submitted for broadcast through Olelo Community Media and shared on social media platforms. We also hope to be able to secure airtime on our local television stations. Ideas for having our PSAs shown to the public are welcome!

The idea for creating these PSAs came up during a Zoom meeting in which the group prepared for their appearance on PDG Cecelia's Best Practices meeting (1/27/25). After much thought, the New Voices Lions felt that such an undertaking was too daunting a project. However, New Voices co-chairs, Lion Pam Lee (Honolulu Chinatown) and Lion Frances Lum (Hawaii Kai), were undeterred. They recruited Lion Shasta Yamada (Koko Head), a certified producer and trainer with Olelo Community Media, to spearhead the project. Lion Shasta majored in film production and has produced over 100 PSAs.

What is involved in the making of a PSA? Here are some highlights:

**Scheduling:** Trying to coordinate the schedules of some of the busiest D50 Lions was quite an achievement! The group



included three of the New Voices Lions (Lion Paul was traveling and filmed his segment separately), two New Voices co-chairs, PID Bob Lee (Honolulu Chinatown), DG Lori Inouye-Yamashita (Manoa), and Producer Lion Shasta.

**Location:** Lion Renee opened her home for two days of filming, but due to the excellent preparation and direction from Lion Shasta, we were able to finish in one afternoon (about 3 hours)!

Scripts: The New Voices Lions were each assigned two global causes and asked to provide four major points about the assigned topic and the goal of each PSA. From their input, Lion Shasta expertly created 30 second and 60 second scripts. These scripts were the biggest challenge of the project, and without the expertise and knowledge of Lion Shasta, it would have been unmanageable.

Successes: Every project has its successes, and here are some of ours. We worked together to find photos that would help the PSAs tell our stories. On the day of filming, Lion Pam worked behind the scenes to help document the afternoon as the project photographer. Lion Frances assisted the group by being the impromptu teleprompter operator. Patrick, a colleague of Lion Shasta, assisted with lighting. The filming flowed

smoothly under Lion Shasta's leadership. And as always, Lions came bearing gifts of food, so we were all well fed.

Thoughts from the New Voices Lions: (Lion Paul was traveling and unable to join us.) Lion Jenny "It was a nerve-wracking experience to be in front of the camera, especially as a representative for the Lions. However, I was proud to be a part of an opportunity that would allow us to speak on

# Q: Why do Hawaii Lions and Lions across the globe go through the trouble to formally and repeatedly introduce dignitaries, ensure correct seating, and participate in ceremonial gestures? Wouldn't it be more expeditious to commence with "just serving?"

A: As part of an International Organization, it is critical that we honor our global organization and its leaders when convening official matters around our global mission: We Serve!
